During these two seminars, Andrew led interactive activities designed to develop students' skills in data visualisation. When writing a scientific paper, you must decide how many figures you need; which information is essential and which is inessential. Next you need to find the optimal way to visually represent these data to best convey your key results/findings. The first seminar presentation of data for a specialist scientific audience and in the second, we worked on visualisation of data for a broader audience. In large teams, students worked from the summary of an academic paper, and limited data, to come up with a broad strategy as to how to visualise the data most effectively. The resulting plans were all effective, some were particularly striking, and in some cases, extremely creative and innovative. As a class, we then viewed how the authors of these papers had chosen to present the same data.
