3/ rebuttals: a chance to respond to each point made by the opposition

We listened to a lively debate between Duncan and Gao Gie, and then between Yuri and Hiroya. Each debater had prepared well, and, under pressure, also provided clear responses to the opposing side. Afterwards the audience broke into discussion groups. Finally, we voted as to who had been the most persuasive presenter. Gao Gie won the most audience votes this time.
