Do you dread arriving at the end of your talk because you just know that someone in the audience is going to ask you that single question that devalues everything you just said? Are you one of those people that always asks "did I answer your question" after each of your responses? Do you consider yourself that one audience member who seems to fire off heat-seeking questions like missiles aimed at the heart of every up-and-coming young scientist?

If you resonate with any of these questions, then you might consider joining us at our next workshop: "**Q&A 101: a roundtable to defuse the confusion**".

In the workshop, we'll discuss the art of the Q&A period following any presentation. After identifying the context and the players, we'll walk through some tips and tricks to help you through one of the most awkward (potentially) situations that exist in academia. We'll discuss some common pitfalls, provide some useful language and tactics, and even address your role as an audience member during a Q&A session.

To get you thinking ahead of this workshop, we'd like you to think about any awkward Q&A experiences you've had in the past. What was the context, what went wrong and why? How did you handle it and did you salvage the situation? Or, did you ultimately fail to handle it well, crashing and burning along the way? We'll start the workshop with your stories from the trenches, so we look forward to seeing you there and sharing both your failures and your successes!
