<p>I attended Psychological meeting on 12th February. I made a poster presentation which titled “Do non-human animals also prefer babies?” It was the first time for me to present the data of my experiment which I’m doing in PRI. This time there are a lot of interesting studies so I focused on listening during the last half time of poster presentation. Both presenting and listening the poster were quite useful. In my experiment I asked whether chimpanzees chose to see baby chimpanzee’s video clip rather than adult chimpanzee’s video. One audience mentioned the possibility that they may habituate either of two types of video clip (e.g. ”baby” video) and may start to choose another type of video (e.g. ”adult” video). I thought about the possibility that they may be habituated each video clip but I did not think about the possibility that they may be habituated the category of video clip. The major of the audience was developmental psychology. I thought this point of view came from his major. I usually do not have many opportunities to talk with researcher who belong to other institute than PRI so I really appreciate this meeting.</p>
