I got great opportunity as an internship in Kaeng Krachan National Park in Thailand. Kaeng Krachan is the largest national park in Thailand and it is famous for wildlife, for example Asian elephants and White-handed gibbon. It is located only 180 km away from Bangkok, so some visitors come to the Kaeng Krachan National Park on weekends.

In my internship, I worked as an assistant of Department of National Park (DNP) staffs. I took part in nature school that is for students. DNP staffs prepare lots of activities for students. For example nature trail in Kaeng krachan National Park, observing aquatic insects. I also participated in some meetings for solving problems between local people and wildlife. Especially, relationship between wild elephants and local people are getting worth recent years. Two men got injured by elephant attack and one ranger died.
